
Smith Reynolds Airport/Whitaker Park Strategic Area Plan





The Airport/Whitaker Park Area Is Poised For An Economic Transformation....

- Significant investment will be coming to Smith Reynolds
 Airport and Whitaker Park over the next few years
 - \$86 million in proposed improvements to the airport
 - \$120 million in proposed improvements to Whitaker Park
- This investment can help spur the surrounding area to become a prime location for economic development





This Plan Recommends Multiple Strategies for Transforming the Area


These strategies include:

- 3. highlighting the connections between this area and the Innovation Quarter/ Downtown Winston-Salem






Area Economic Development Triangle

Four Community Meetings Were Held to Gather Citizen/Stakeholder Input – 250 Attendees







Example Citizen/Stakeholder Kickoff Meeting Comments

- Attract aviation-related businesses that pay a living wage and employ area residents
- Provide education opportunities for residents
- Provide assistance to businesses that are already in the area
- Install sidewalks, street trees, and street lights
- Improve curb appeal/remove dilapidated buildings



Overview of Plan Recommendations

- Plan recommendations were developed based on citizen input; the 2017 Chamber Aerotropolis Study; and input with Greater W-S, Inc., City/County staff, the Airport, and Forsyth Tech
- These recommendations support 5 overall goals:
 - 1. Strengthen transportation linkages between the Airport, Whitaker Park, and Downtown/IQ
 - 2. Make the airport/surrounding area an attractive gateway to the City
 - 3. Recruit aviation/aerospace-related businesses
 - 4. Cultivate the job skills of area residents
 - 5. Promote business assistance programs



Goal: Strengthen Transportation Linkages Between the Airport, Whitaker Park, and Downtown/IQ

Conduct a Transportation/Telecommunications Assessment to:

- Determine locations for visitor wayfinding signs
- Ensure that transit routes coincide with employer shift changes
- Provide state-of-the-art telecommunications infrastructure



Goal: Make Smith Reynolds Airport An Attractive Gateway to the City

- Prepare a comprehensive streetscape plan for Akron Drive and Liberty Street
- Encourage development of 10,000 15,000 sf "flex space" buildings along Akron Dr. and Liberty St.







Goal: Recruit Aerospace-Related Businesses

- Encourage local business recruiters to attend aviation-related trade shows
- Develop marketing materials promoting the Airport,
 Whitaker Park, and Innovation Quarter/Downtown
- Target start-up companies involving drones and similar technology to locate in the area





Goal: Cultivate the Job Skills of Area Residents

- Develop a coordinated School System/Forsyth Tech curriculum for aviation-related career training
- Offer scholarships allowing area workers over age 21 to attend Forsyth Tech for retraining and degree programs
- Encourage the recruitment of area residents to fill new jobs
- Use local incentives to attract employers that pay living wages

Goal: Promote Local Business Assistance Programs

- City Building Improvement Rehabilitation Program
- City Small Business Loan Program
- City Business Training Program
- Urban Commercial Areas (RUCAs)
- Small Business Center at Forsyth Tech
