Learning the hardware and software on the laptop they are receiving. Essential computer use skills (mouse and keyboard); important vocabulary; using the Microsoft Windows operating system and basic apps; keeping their device working well. Saving files; creating and moving files and folders; deleting files.

Essential Internet Skills

Connecting to Wi-Fi; browsing and searching the web; using online forms; and using email. Key tips on how to stay safe online such as using strong passwords and identifying and avoiding scams, phishing attempts, and identity theft.

Computer Basics


