RESOLUTION AWARDING A SOLE SOURCE CONTRACT TO JOHNSON CONTROLS FIRE PROTECTION LP FOR FIRE SAFETY UPGRADES IN BENTON SOUTH

WHEREAS, last fall, the City completed a \$1.6 million project to refresh the meeting spaces in the former Grand Pavilion ballroom and conference center located under the Embassy Suites Hotel; and

WHEREAS, the spaces since have been rebranded The Gallery Ballroom and Benton South; and

WHEREAS, recently, the Fire Marshall performed an inspection of the City-owned spaces and found several areas not in compliance with fire code. As a result, the City needs to replace fire sprinkler heads that are tied into an existing fire suppression system, as well as fire doors; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost to address the issues cited by the inspection totals \$45,000; and

WHEREAS, the fire suppression system and sprinkler heads were manufactured by Johnson Control, so all associated work is proprietary to Johnson Controls; and

WHEREAS, N.C.G.S. 143-129(e) provides that formal bid procedures "shall not apply to purchases of apparatus, supplies, materials, or equipment when: (i) performance or price competition for a product are not available or (ii) a needed product is available from only one source of supply;" and

WHEREAS, replacement of the sprinkler heads, which comprises most of the cost, totals \$32,294.62.

Winston-Salem City Council APPROVED May 16, 2022

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem, upon the recommendation of the Finance Committee, hereby award a sole source contract to Johnson Controls Fire Protection LP for \$32,294.62 to replace sprinkler heads in The Gallery Ballroom and Benton South meeting spaces.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the award of this contract constitutes a preliminary determination as to the qualification of the bidder. The City is not legally bound to perform the contract until it is duly executed by the City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City will fund this project using occupancy tax fund balance.
