SUBJECT: Demolitions for August 10, 2026
Community Development/Housing/General Government Committee Meeting

Historic Resources staff has reviewed the three (3) properties that are scheduled to go before the Community Development/Housing/General Government Committee on August 10, 2026, for demolition consideration. Per the list provided by Neighborhood Services, the proposed demolition is:

1. 1511 Attucks Street– East Ward
2. 3005 Teresa Avenue - Northeast Ward – Contributing building in the Castle Heights Historic District, a North Carolina Study List District
3. 2608 Stockton Street – Southeast Ward

Only 3005 Teresa Avenue is currently listed in the Castle Heights Historic District, which is listed on the North Carolina Study List of historic properties. The other two properties are not currently listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places nor are they local designated as part of a local district or as a Local Historic Landmark.

If demolition for this structure is approved, Historic Resources staff requests that the Community Development Department have the structures professionally photo-documented and submit the photos to the Forsyth County Historic Resources Commission.
