## RESOLUTION AWARDING PURCHASE ORDER FOR TWO SIDE-LOADING REFUSE TRUCKS

WHEREAS, the Sanitation Department budgeted to purchase two side-loading refuse trucks as replacements for equipment that exceeds Fleet's replacement criteria; and

WHEREAS, The Heil Company was awarded competitive bid contract #110223-THC on January 11, 2024, by Sourcewell (Staples, MN), a cooperative purchasing group that solicits competitive bids on a national scale and awards contracts for refuse collection vehicles with related equipment, accessories and services; and

WHEREAS, Carolina Environmental Systems, Inc., the sole authorized Heil distributor for North Carolina, offered a quotation for two side-loading refuse trucks at a cost of \$406,885 each, with standard options selected by the City, for a total cost of \$813,770; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends that a purchase order be awarded to Carolina Environmental Systems, Inc. for two side-loading refuse trucks. This recommendation is in accordance with N.C.G.S. 143-129(e)(3), an exception to formal bidding which authorizes "purchases made through a competitive bidding group purchasing program, which is a formally organized program that offers competitively obtained purchasing products and services at discount prices to two or more public agencies".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem, upon approval of the Finance Committee, that the purchase order is hereby awarded to Carolina Environmental Systems, Inc., per Sourcewell contract #110223-THC, for two side-loading refuse trucks at a cost of \$406,885 each, for a total cost of \$813,770.
