**RESOLUTION AWARDING CONTRACT FOR INDOOR
BASKETBALL COURT REPLACEMENTS AT VARIOUS COMMUNITY CENTERS**

WHEREAS, after proper advertisement, bids were received and publicly opened by City/County Purchasing at 12:00 p.m. on Friday, December 18, 2020, for the purchase with installation to replace five indoor basketball courts at Sprague, Miller, Sims, and Martin Luther King Jr. Community Centers and the following bids were received:

WHEREAS, the low bid is within the available 2018 G.O. Bond funding; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Finance Committee that a contract be awarded to Sports Court Solutions by Floor Action, Inc., the low bidder meeting specifications, for the purchase with installation to replace five indoor basketball courts at Sprague, Miller, Sims, and Martin Luther King Jr. Community Centers in the total amount of \$399,950.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem that the contract for the purchase with installation to replace five indoor basketball courts at Sprague, Miller, Sims, and Martin Luther King Jr. Community Centers per bid specifications is hereby awarded to Sports Court Solutions by Floor Action, Inc. in the total amount of \$399,950. The City Manager and City Clerk are authorized to execute the contract on behalf of the City, with contract to be approved by the City Attorney.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the award of this contract constitutes a preliminary determination as to the qualifications of the bidder. The City is not legally bound to perform the contract until the contract is duly executed by the City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that funds have been previously appropriated and made available in the 2018 G.O. Bond to cover the cost of this contract.
