- ISO works for the insurance industry
- Property insurance companies use a fire department's PPC to help evaluate a community's risk of fire loss and determine insurance premiums
- Fire departments are graded every five years

- ISO grades the fire department, water supply, and communications according to the Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS)
 - Ability to control fire and deliver risk reduction services only; no assessment of other FD services
 - Water system and hydrants
 - 911 communications
- PPC from 1 to 10 assigned based on possible score of 105.5
 - PPC 1 = best possible rating
 - PPC 10 =no fire protection
