RESOLUTION AWARDING PURCHASE ORDER FOR POTHOLE REPAIR TRUCK

WHEREAS, the Street Maintenance Division of the Field Operations Department has the immediate need to replace a pothole repair truck that exceeds Fleet Services criteria for replacement; and

WHEREAS, On October 5, 2021, Sourcewell, a cooperative purchasing group, awarded competitive bid contract #080521-PBL per bid specification to PB Loader Corporation of Fresno, CA; and

WHEREAS, Infrastructure Solutions Group, Inc. of Mooresville, N.C., the authorized local PB Loader Corporation dealer has offered a quotation for a Ford F-550 chassis with asphalt patching equipment that meets specifications required by the City in the amount of \$193,884; and

WHEREAS, N.C.G.S. 143-129(e)(3) authorizes "purchases made through a competitive bidding group purchasing program, which is a formally organized program that offers competitively obtained purchasing products and services at discount prices to two or more public agencies"; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Finance Committee that a purchase order be awarded to Infrastructure Solutions Group, Inc. for a Ford F-550 chassis with asphalt patching equipment that meets specifications required by the City in the amount of \$193,884.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem, that a purchase order is hereby awarded to Infrastructure Solutions Group, Inc. for a Ford F-550 chassis with asphalt patching equipment that meets specifications required by the City in the amount of \$193,884. This recommendation is in accordance with N.C.G.S. 143-

129(e)(3), and that the bid specifications, the company's proposal, and the City's purchase order will constitute the contract.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that award of this purchase order constitutes a preliminary determination as to the qualifications of the bidder. The City is not legally bound to perform the purchase order until the purchase order is duly executed by the City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this purchase is included in the FY 2022-23 capital budget and will be financed through the City's internal leasing program.
