- Petitioner: Planning and Development Services and Community Development staff
- Request: Amend Chapter 6 of the City Code to revise rules for keeping chickens or other fowl.



- Planning staff was asked to review City Code standards for keeping chickens.
- Requirements for keeping chickens were also researched for eight peer cities in North Carolina.
- An information item was presented at the May 10<sup>th</sup> Community Development/Housing/General Government Committee where staff was directed to proceed with developing revised standards for keeping chickens, based on Council comments. This item was continued from the June Committee meeting

- Planning staff found that current coop/run setbacks were generally more than double those of peer cities.
- Most peer cities provide flexibility on the number of chickens or fowl allowed based on lot size.
- The majority of our peer cities do not require a zoning permit to keep chickens.



- Current City Code standards for keeping chickens include:
  - The coop and/or run must be setback a minimum of 100 feet from any adjacent property line. Notarized approval from adjoining neighbors can reduce setbacks to a minimum of 25 feet.
  - The maximum number of chickens allowed on residentially zoned property is 5; no roosters are allowed.
  - A zoning permit is required for keeping chickens.



- Based on Committee feedback and best practices, staff is proposing the following ordinance revisions:
  - Reducing coop setbacks from adjacent property 100 feet to 20 feet.
  - Eliminating adjacent property owner approval requirement.
  - Eliminating the zoning permit requirement.
