General Use Rezoning from LO to CB (W-3549

6835-15-6438.000, 6835-15-6349.000, 6835-15-6289.000, 6835-15-5455.000

You are receiving this notice of the rezoning because you live or own property near the proposed site. The approximant 1.3 acres is located on the south side of West First Street, between South Marshall St and South Cherry St in Northwest Ward. The parcels above are currently within the LO zoning district, with a proposed zoning to general CB. This zoning would allow us to have small weddings on the property while keeping and preserving the current historic look and nature. These changes have already been approved by the Forsyth County Historic Commission.

With this letter, we are asking the Winston Salem council for a zoning change. Through this process the petitioner is required to hold an informal drop-in meeting to answer any questions neighbors may have. This meeting will be held Monday October 24th from 5:00 to 6:00pm at our office address below.
