### **Council Action Requested**:

Consideration of Amendments to the FY 2017-18 Budget Ordinances for the City of Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

### Summary of Information:

The proposed amendments to the FY 2017-18 budget ordinances authorize adjustments for the following purposes.

## **Appropriation of Grants and Other Revenues Received**

□ The Police Department has received additional federal forfeiture funds from the United States Department of Justice totaling \$249,700 and additional state controlled substance tax receipts from the Office of the State Auditor totaling \$28,430 to be used for the following: officer training (\$150,000), K-9 supplies including dog food and veterinarian expenses (\$60,000), informant funds (\$15,000), and the purchase of equipment (\$53,130).

<b>Remarks:</b>			

- □ Walk & Roll Winston-Salem is the city's open streets event, which temporarily closes several downtown streets to motor vehicles to provide a safe and fun place for people to walk, bike, and play. Since 2017, the city has partnered with the Winston-Salem Cycling Classic to conduct the Walk & Roll Winston-Salem event in conjunction with the Cycling Classic's road cycling races on Memorial Day. The race organizers manage street closures, food options, entertainment, and other event details, allowing Walk & Roll Winston-Salem organizers to focus on event promotion and safety education. The Wake Forest Innovation Quarter has long been a partner in organizing Walk & Roll Winston-Salem events and for 2018 has offered to sponsor the event in the amount of \$1,500. This sponsorship will allow staff to promote the event through social and print media and purchase event supplies, including shirts identifying volunteers as Walk & Roll Winston-Salem staff.
- □ The City of Winston-Salem has been awarded a grant from the North Carolina Clean Energy Technology Center to convert seven vehicles to use propane as a bifuel energy system. The expected result from the alternative fuel portion of this project is to reduce the overall greenhouse gas emissions of each vehicle converted by 30% annually. In addition, the city believes the cleaner burning fuel will not only reduce emissions but reduce the cost of annual operations and maintenance. The total grant amount is \$153,600 and includes a local match of 20%. The proposed amendment appropriates the grant and the local match.

#### Feasibility Study of a North-South Streetcar Route

□ The April Finance Committee meeting included a request for \$50,000 to assist in funding a feasibility study of a north-south streetcar route. The route would create a streetcar connection along the rail corridor that encompasses, in part, WFIQ's Rails to Trails project now known as Long Branch Trail. The original corridor runs from just south of 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to just south of Smith-Reynolds Airport. The concept under study is whether the streetcar rails can be extended south to connect Winston-Salem State University and west to connect Whitaker Park, BB&T Field and the Wake Forest University campus. The feasibility study is estimated to cost between \$100,000 and \$125,000 and Wake Forest University and WFIQ have agreed to contribute \$25,000 each toward the cost. In addition to the City, funding support is being sought from Winston-Salem State University and the Winston-Salem Foundation. The proposed amendment appropriates \$50,000 in economic development bond funds for this study.
