## **Summary of Information:**

The City of Winston-Salem and Forsyth County are eligible to share \$182,029 in grant funding under the 2018 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG). The City and County have been certified by the U.S. Department of Justice to be "disparate jurisdictions," where the City is scheduled to receive one and one-half times more JAG funding than the County, and the County bears more than 50 percent of the costs of incarceration that arise for Part 1 Violent Crimes reported by the City. The original pre-determined allocation of \$182,029 in disparate JAG funding is as follows:

City of Winston-Salem: \$157,358 Forsyth County: \$24,671
