

WHEREAS: approximately 3,500 Americans die in fires annually, more than all

other natural disasters combined; and

WHEREAS: fire causes over \$14 billion in annual property loss in the United

States, including \$10.5 million in Winston-Salem during 2017; and

WHEREAS: the Winston-Salem Fire Department responded to 335 building fires in

2017; and

WHEREAS: the proliferation of synthetic furnishings in the modern fire

environment has reduced the time to escape a residential fire to less

than four minutes; and

WHEREAS: Fire Prevention Week is observed during the Sunday through Saturday

period in which October 9th falls, coinciding with the anniversary of

the Great Chicago Fire of 1871; and

WHEREAS: the 2018 Fire Prevention Week theme is "Look. Listen. Learn. Be

aware—fire can happen anywhere"; and

WHEREAS: the Winston-Salem Fire Department conducts fire prevention activities

nearly every day, but is particularly focused on fire prevention during

the entire month of October.
