Pedestrian Crash Data and Analysis.

Staff was asked to prepare a report on traffic crashes involving pedestrians for the February Public Works Committee meeting to help identify priority improvements. Based on input from Council Members at that meeting, staff prepared three additional items and will be available to present information on the data, analytical techniques and conclusions.

1. Pedestrian crash chart with day/night information for each incident.
2. Pedestrian crash map relating crash locations to the locations of signalized intersections with the availability of pedestrian signals.
3. Pedestrian crash map relating crash locations to the availability of sidewalk.

Findings:

- 29 of 33 fatal pedestrian crashes occurred during times of darkness.
- 67% of all pedestrian crashes occurred on street segments with sidewalk present on at least one side of the street.
- Approximately 265 of 374 signalized intersections have no pedestrian signalization.
- Approximately 57 of 374 signalized intersections have partial pedestrian signalization.
- Approximately 52 of 374 signalized intersections have full pedestrian signalization.
