The Department of Transportation is relocating the Traffic Management Center to a new location at Union Station and have requested bids for a contractor who can assist in bringing the system online at Union Station and build a new video display, including all hardware, software, and other incidentals required for the City's new Traffic Management Center. The Winston-Salem Transit Authority (WSTA) will use the space vacated to house their Call-Center and Trans-Aid Dispatchers and to conduct assessments for clients seeking to qualify for TransAid transportation. Bids were requested for the complete relocation of the Traffic Management Center, per specifications and on March 22, 2019, the following bid was received: City/State **Total Cost** Protronix, Inc.
