Summary of Information:

The Winston-Salem Police Department (WSPD) has the opportunity to apply for the 2019 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program, a federal grant from the National Institute of Justice. This competitive grant is awarded to states and units of local government to help improve forensic science and medical examiner/coroner services.

WSPD wishes to submit an application for this grant, requesting \$75,452 in grant funding for the following:

• Upgraded Dataworks Plus Livescan (\$32,000) Funding will be used to purchase a new Livescan system that will reach its "end of life" later this year. The Livescan system is used by WSPD Forensic Services Division personnel for all arrestee fingerprinting during processing at the Forsyth County Detention Center.
