## **Summary of Information:**

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) has made available federal Safe Routes to School Non-Infrastructure funds with the goal encouraging local communities to create innovative bicycle and pedestrian education, encouragement, and enforcement programs to increase the safety of active transportation options. In 2010, the City used Safe Routes to School non-infrastructure funds to implement an innovative bicycle and pedestrian education program. The program continues to operate and has reached over 7,000 students since its inception.

In March 2019, City Council authorized staff to make application to NCDOT for additional Safe Routes to School Non-Infrastructure funds, which was approved, resulting in an award of \$251,100.
