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PARKS & RECREATION

Golf Course Irrigation System Replacements. This project provides for the renovation and replacement of the on-course irrigation boxes and the central irrigation control system at Winston Lake and Reynolds Park Golf Courses. The current irrigation systems are more than 27 years old and require more frequent routine maintenance. This project will replace approximately 353 sprinkler heads at Winston Lake Golf Course and 372 heads at Reynolds Park Golf Course. \$800,000

Playground Safety Resurfacing. This project provides for the annual maintenance of playground safety surfacing at various parks throughout the City. Playground resurfacing is needed for compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, Consumer Product Safety Commission, and the American Society for Testing and Materials. \$290,000

Recreation Maintenance Projects. This project provides for the replacement and updates of playgrounds throughout the parks system. Playgrounds are replaced based on safety assessments, condition of equipment and overall usage. Playgrounds included are at the following park locations: Brushy Fork, Winston Lake #1, #3, and #4.

STREETS AND SIDEWALKS

Meadowlark Drive Widening. This project provides funds to widen Meadowlark Drive from Country Club Road to the Villas at Robinhood apartment community (near Robinhood Road). This widening is needed to address increased traffic due to residential development and growth at Meadowlark Elementary and Middle Schools. \$3,000,000

Novack Bridge Repair. The bridge on Novack Street has experienced numerous flooding events to the point that the bridge has failed and is no longer safe to cross. It is currently closed. Replacement of the bridge has become an urgent priority. While City staff have explored options such as the construction of a culvert bridge, the recommended solution is complete replacement of the bridge.
