**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPROVE THE  
FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION FISCAL YEAR 2020 SECTION 5307  
FORMULA FUNDING SUB-ALLOCATION OR SPLIT LETTER FOR THE  
PIEDMONT AUTHORITY FOR REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION (PART)**

**WHEREAS**, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) FY 2020 Section 5307 Formula funds are appropriated to urban areas with more than 200,000 in population; and

**WHEREAS**, the Winston-Salem's Urban area receives a full appropriation of the FY 2020 Section 5307 Formula funding in the amount of \$5,386,052; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Winston-Salem is the designated recipient of this funding for the Winston-Salem Urban area; and

**WHEREAS**, these funds are sub-allocated to three transit agencies serving the MPO urban area (Winston-Salem Transit Authority, Piedmont Authority for Regional Transportation and Davidson County Transportation) and for JARC subrecipients; and

**WHEREAS**, Winston-Salem Transit Authority receives \$4,327,970, the Piedmont Authority for Regional Transportation (PART) receives \$650,397, Davidson County Transportation receives \$352,685 and JARC agencies receive \$55,000; and

**WHEREAS**, as a current direct recipient of FTA funding, PART is eligible to apply directly to FTA for their portion of the FY 2020 Section 5307 Formula funds provided the City of Winston-Salem issues a sub-allocation or split letter; and

**WHEREAS**, the sub-allocation letter indicates to FTA that the direct recipient, PART, will apply for the funding separately and also releases oversight responsibilities of fund administration from the designated recipient, or City of Winston-Salem; and

**WHEREAS**, staff recommends issuing a split letter to PART for the FY 2020 Section 5307 Formula funds.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Winston-Salem hereby authorizes the City Manager and City Secretary to execute a sub-allocation letter with PART for FY 2020 Section 5307 Formula funds totaling \$650,397.
