Update Regarding Business 40 Multi-Use Path

Because of NCDOT's current financial constraints, city staff will now be responsible for the remainder of the design and construction of the Business 40 Multi-Use Path (MUP) from Lockland Avenue to the Strollway. The project is funded through federal and local sources and staff is currently coordinating with NCDOT to transfer management of the project. NCDOT constructed critical elements of the path as part of the Business 40 highway project and has also prepared construction designs for the section of the path from 4th Street to the Strollway. Phasing, budget, and schedule details are provided below.

Phasing

Phase I: Green Street to the Strollway. This phase represents the MUP work left uncompleted from the Business 40 highway project. NCDOT prepared construction drawings and the city will be responsible for bidding and construction management.

Phase II: Peters Creek Parkway to Lockland Avenue. This phase represents the section of the path outside of the scope of work for the Business 40 highway project and will connect the Phase I project to Baptist Medical Center and surrounding neighborhoods.
