The Winston-Salem/Forsyth County government leaders and agencies became actively engaged in shaping a comprehensive gang prevention strategy by leading the creation of the W-S/FC Gang Reduction Steering Committee. The committee's work is based upon targeted suppression, direct intervention, and prevention programs and activities. The committee adopted a strategic plan in 2010 that continues to guide their work.

What is a "Gang"???

NCGS 15A 1340.16(2a)

 Any ongoing organization, association or group of three or more persons, whether formal or informal, having as one of its primary activities the commission of a felony or violent misdemeanor offenses, or delinquent acts that would be felonies or violent misdemeanors if committed by an adult, and having a common name or common identifying sign, colors or symbol.

.....that's nice, so what do we look for in a gang?

- 1. THREE OR MORE PERSONS
- 2. COMMIT FELONIES OR VIOLENT MISDEMEANORS
- 3. COMMON NAME, SIGN, SYMBOL or COLORS

Validation Process/Intelligence Files

Self-Admission of Gang Membership	Physical Evidence of Gang Membership
Reliable Source (including parent/guardian)	Tattoo's/Markings Assoc. with Gang
Gang Symbols, Hand Signs, or Graffiti	Gang Language/Terminology
Display of Colors or Style of Dress	Social Media Appearance Promoting Gang
Involvement in Gang Activity	(Blank Box)

- Once validated, gang members have an "alert" placed in the system that lasts for 5 years (28 C.F.R. § 23.20)
- Gang alert is purged after 5 years if member has no other gang contacts
- GangNet is the state database for all gang intelligence files

- The Gang Unit monitors approximately 1,588 subjects (validated gang members, suspected gang members, and former gang members)
- There are approximately 30 active gangs in Winston-Salem


Gang Unit 2019

- In 2019, the Gang Unit handled 400 calls for service, with 179 of those calls resulting in a written report.
- During the same time frame, the Gang Unit made 499 arrests, including 104 felonies, 378 misdemeanors, and 17 traffic infractions.
- The Gang Unit provided 34 community presentations in 2019

Gang Unit 2020

- So far in 2020, the Gang Unit has made 664 arrests: 137 felonies, 480 misdemeanors, and 47 infractions
- The Gang Unit has seized over \$212,256 in property (guns, drugs, vehicles, etc.)
- The Gang Unit has seized 49 guns
- The Gang Unit has responded to 712 calls for service that have resulted in 397 reports written

Location of Gang Members




Spray Paint Sales Operation

- "Sec. 38-15.1. Injuring, or destroying public property; graffiti declared public nuisance; removal of graffiti from public and private property.; sale of spray paint to minors and possession of spray paint by minors
- The Gang Unit utilizes WSPD Explorers in an undercover capacity
 - Explorers (under 18) attempt to purchase spray paint from local stores
 - If successful, stores are cited for violating the city ordinance
 - The goal is to educate stores on the ordinance banning the sale of spray paint to minors
 - This will hopefully make it difficult for juveniles to obtain spray paint, and a result there will be fewer graffiti incidents
 - DA's Office is consulted about charges/prosecution
 - Operation is for education of the vendors

NCGIA Gang Conference

- Winston-Salem has hosted the NC Gang Investigators Association Professional Conference since 2017
- The Conference is held each year in August and will return to our city in 2021
- Hundreds of law enforcement professionals from all over the world attend the conference to learn about gangs and gang trends
