## **Summary of Information:**

The Winston-Salem Urban Area is a direct recipient of the Section 5307 grant funds from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) grant program. For the 2020 Fiscal Year, the Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) allocated \$55,000 of those funds to be used for Job Access Reverse Commute (JARC) programs. This program assists eligible entities in meeting the transportation needs of low income and welfare recipients to employment and employment related activities/opportunities in the MPO area.

In order to award these funds, the Winston-Salem Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WSUAMPO) held a 30-day call for projects between 30-day call for projects between August 24th and September 24 and conducted an applicant workshop on September 10.
