SPEEDING PREVENTION WHAT YOU CAN DO

Spread the word about danger created by neighborhood spe





Park your car legally along the street, and get your neighbors to do the same. Parallel parking narrows the travel lane, naturally slowing traffic.



REMINDERS

- Always obey the posted speed limit.

- If you see people outside, give them courtesy and slow down

- If you can't see them, they can't see you. Always check your blind spots.

- Be extra cautious for children while you back-up.



Pedestrian Safety

- 2021 16 total pedestrian crashes 2 of which resulted in fatalities (April 2021)
- 2020 89 total pedestrian crashes 4 of which resulted in fatalities
- 2019 1 pedestrian fatality
- 2018 9 pedestrian fatalities

100% occurred outside of a crosswalk








Two-lane roadway with a center turning lane






Roadway of four lanes or more with a center turning lane
