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RESOLUTION AWARDING PURCHASE ORDER FOR FIRE PUMPER TRUCKS

WHEREAS, Winston-Salem Fire Department has the need to purchase two fire pumper trucks, one as a replacement for truck #1091, a 2007 Sutphen/HS4297 pumper with 158,511 miles and has accrued \$199,921 of repair and maintenance costs, and one truck to be stationed at Station 13 on Bethel Methodist Church Lane; and

WHEREAS, the Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC), a competitive bidding group purchasing program, received bids for fire service apparatus and on November 18, 2019, The Sutphen Corporation, located in Dublin, Ohio, was awarded competitive bid contract #FS12-19 product code FS19IIC04 specifications for the pumper trucks and offers the Sutphen Heavy Duty fire pumper trucks per HGAC specifications, including the performance bond, at a cost of \$663,697.57 each for a total cost of \$1,327,395.14; and

WHEREAS, N.C.G.S. 143-129(e)(3) authorizes "purchases made through a competitive bidding group purchasing program, which is a formally organized program that offers competitively obtained purchasing products and services at discount prices to two or more public agencies"; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Finance Committee that a purchase order be awarded to The Sutphen Corporation for the purchase of two Sutphen Heavy Duty fire pumper trucks per competitive bid contract #FS12-19 product code FS19IIC04 specifications, including the performance bond, at a cost of \$663,697.57 each for a total cost of \$1,327,395.14.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem, that a purchase order is hereby awarded to The Sutphen Corporation for the purchase of two Sutphen Heavy Duty fire pumper trucks per competitive bid contract #FS12-19
