Resolution Revising the City Council's Affirmation of the Sale of Certain City-Owned Land by Private Sale (N.C.G.S. 160A-279) to United Health Centers (East Ward)

Summary of Information:

On September 16, 2016, the Mayor and City Council approved a resolution authorizing the sale of certain City-owned land by private sale to United Health Centers. The resolution authorized the sale of a combined area of 0.83 acres for \$1 (Parcel Identification Numbers 6836-52-3201, 6836-52-2179, 6836-52-2196, 6836-52-2049, and 6836-52-1112 located at the southwest corner of Liberty Street and 14th Street in the East Ward). The sale was approved according to N.C.G.S. 160A-279 and 160A-514, which set forth the procedures for selling certain City-owned land to non-profit entities carrying out a public purpose and the redevelopment of property in a redevelopment area consistent with the Council-adopted redevelopment plan.

Since the approval of the resolution authorizing the private sale to UHC, the Liberty Street Redevelopment Plan has expired (January 1, 2020); thus, part of the authorization for the sale as part of a formal redevelopment effort no longer is relevant. On September 20, 2021, the Mayor and City Council approved a resolution affirming the previously authorized sale of the City's land to UHC for \$1 to carry out a public purpose only under N.C.G.S. 160A-279. One of the parcels (6836-52-2179) mistakenly was not noted in the resolution. United Health Centers has requested a technical adjustment to the resolution to include all the parcels.
