## G GENERAL AGENDA

**G-1.** <u>19-0018</u> Resolution Ratifying Action Taken on November 15, 2018 and Authorizing City Manager, or His Designee, to Accept Less than Full Repayment of Construction Loans to S.G. Atkins Community Development Corporation.

Marla Newman, Director of Community Development, gave the staff report.

*Council Member Clark requested for staff to include in the resolution a maximum limit.* 

This Resolution was continued to the Community Development/Housing/General Government Committee, on 2/11/2019.

**G-2.** <u>19-0025</u> Consideration of Deobligation of Uncommitted HOME Funds from Program Year 2014.

Marla Newman, Director of Community Development, gave the staff report.

Council Member Larson asked for clarification on how the HOME funds worked. Mrs. Newman explained that it is similar to a line of credit, that is cumulative with each year.

Council Member MacIntosh asked what this specific line of credit from 2014 would have been used for. Mrs. Newman stated that it would have been used for affordable housing, and the loss of this money resulted in the loss of six to seven affordable housing units.

**G-3.** <u>18-0864</u> Consideration of Resolution Establishing the City of Winston-Salem Affordable Housing Program Through the Sale or Lease of City Owned Residential Properties.

Angela Carmon, City Attorney, gave the staff report.

Council Member Besse recommended that staff look at additional pre-screening of properties owned by the City, as some properties would not be suitable for affordable housing units.

Chair Adams asked staff to get this information out to citizens. She requested a report regarding zoning for these properties, as she believes some properties are too small to build single family homes.

*Council Member Clark voiced his reservations with setting 30, 50, or 99 year restrictions, as it could potentially scare people from buying the properties.* 

Lee Garrity, City Manager, clarified that this would only be one tool, used in conjunction with other programs, to increase affordable housing in Winston-Salem.

Chair Adams noted that if the City does not put restrictions on these properties for affordable housing, they won't last, and the City will be right back where we started. She also pointed out that the majority of these properties are located in African-American neighborhoods.

Council Member Clark recommended staff to communicate with the

contractors in the area, and find out what would get them excited about building on these properties.

Council Member MacIntosh asked staff to collaborate with the County and to get a list of properties they own, so that the City could possibly partner to provide more affordable housing.

# G-4. <u>19-0068</u> Information on the Fourth Street Public Art Project.

Kelly Bennett, Planning and Development Services, gave the staff report.

*Chair Adams asked if the Links Apartments had affordable housing, and for a report on the rent for the apartments.* 

*Vice Chair Scippio noted that she would like to see local artists only, and to strongly consider African-American artists.*
